Requirements:

- Graduate of medical school approved by the LCME of the AMA, or the American Osteopathic Association, or ECFMG certification
- Graduate from a Neurology residency program approved by the ACGME, or the Committee on Postdoctoral Training of the AOA
- Possessing board certification in Neurology by the ABPN
- Experience of a minimum of 2 years fulltime practice within the past 3 years as a Neurologist including evaluation and treatment of TBI patients
- Possessing a current, unrestricted license from any of the U.S. States or Territories

Compensation: \$270,000 to \$277,000 (gross annual)

Time off: 5 weeks of paid time off per year, as well as 80 hours of paid holiday time off per year

Work week: Monday – Friday; between the hours of 7:00AM – 4:30PM (will not work more than 80 hours per two week period)

Patient population: The men and women of the U.S. Marine Corps, active duty and those leaving active duty. The PHTBI is initiated to address gaps in the care available for the prevalent injuries among combatants in the global war on terrorism. PHTBI seeks to ensure access to psychological health and traumatic brain injury care for all beneficiary patients.
